To our Neutral Ground Family,

We would like to thank each and every one of you for coming out to our annual Summer Night Lights (SNL) programming, and welcome you to the first issue of Neutral Ground's official newsletter!

Meet Our Founder & Executive Director: Pastor Nati Alvarado

Nati Alvarado was born, raised, and currently resides in Santa Ana, where he has now cultivated over 30 years of gang and violence prevention, intervention, and mediation as well as street outreach and in-school restorative practices.

When Nati was just 13 years old, he was arrested for the first time, and at 15, he became a young father amidst his developing heroin addiction and cycles of drugs, gangs, and incarceration. In turn, he spent a significant portion of his youth in and out of juvenile and adult detention centers.

The vision of Neutral Ground manifested from his life riddled with incarceration, in which Nati began to understand the significance of creating spaces that are neutral for those who have reacted to their marginalization with the implicit dehumanization of others. He began understanding that violence stems from individuals dehumanizing others, and that one thing the carceral system did was bring people together in one place where they were forced to learn that those surrounding them were just as vulnerable and human as they are—even when they came from different neighborhoods.

In 1990, at the age of 30, following his time in a post-carceral Christian Rehabilitation program, Nati began setting the building blocks of what was to become the foundation of Neutral Ground, cementing his vision to *change the story* of youth justice and preventing community violence. In the beginning, all he carried with him was his life experience; no funding. In 2000 he began a transitional housing program, a passion project, which would not begin receiving official grant funding and non-profit recognition for close to 20 years. But what Nati emphasizes is that it never has and never will matter if the money is there, because him and Neutral Ground always will be.

Through Nati's House transitional housing program, he amplified his mission and goals to establish Neutral Ground, returning to the streets to give back to a community he had once damaged. He has been *changing the story* in Orange County for over 32 years, so that those cycles of gangs, drugs, and incarceration that had once entrenched him would no longer swallow up the kids in his community.

Because of Nati Alvarado, Neutral Ground exists as an agency that is truly homegrown, and reflective of the heart and human capital of the City of Santa Ana. Serving as the Founder and Executive Director of Neutral Ground, Nati is *changing the story* every single day.



Summer Night Lights:

The More You Know!

what is Summer Night Lights (SNL)?

Summer Night Lights is like a big party at the park, but for a really amazing cause! Every year throughout July - August, Neutral Ground hosts a 5-week summer prevention program, SNL, in which we serve approximately 400-500 community members per night. Every Friday for 5 weeks, NG keeps the lights on at El Salvador Park, where we provide free food, lead carnival games for kids, host sports tournaments, bring in live bands & DJ's, and so much more! All of our activities are free, and serve as diversions from maladaptive activities for youth, helping to cultivate social connections that replace gang-involvement. We also utilize our SNL grant funding to hire local youth from the community to help us facilitate the event. Summer Night Lights provides a platform for our community to reclaim El Salvador Park, and serves as a critical violence prevention strategy, all while being fun and family-friendly!

what is the history of SNL? in Santa Ana?

In 2007, the Office of Gang Reduction & Youth Development (GRYD) was established in Los Angeles to reduce gang-related violent crime. GRYD “determined that a lack of safe and accessible public space, oppressive economic conditions, and crowded housing situations created high levels of stress within families, potentially driving kids to hang out on streets and increasing their likelihood of becoming involved in unhealthy activities or becoming victims of violence and crime” (City Parks Alliance) To address this, they designed Summer Night Lights, and in 2008, SNL was credited with “reducing gang violence to its lowest level since 1976” (City Parks Alliance).

Neutral Ground began hosting SNL in Santa Ana in 2018, and has facilitated it annually up to now, 2022. Since we began hosting it, we have seen significant reductions in graffiti/tagging, in gang-related violence, and in local 911 calls during our programming weeks. NG is truly paving the way for the first centralized model of gang prevention/intervention services in Orange County.

what is the significance of SNL?

Violence prevention benefits every single member of the community, which means that Summer Night Lights is positively impacting you and your family and friends. In addition to the dramatic reductions in the aforementioned components, SNL has impacts that are less quantifiable, but so critical: kids not going to sleep hungry, community members not engaging in crime and violence, individuals who are gang-involved witnessing what our parks are truly meant for. Summer Night Lights gives our community the chance to feel safe and secure, and provides our youth with opportunities to engage in activities that catalyze healthy social-emotional development. It also is a reminder that community-based leadership can create enormous strides in public safety initiatives.

how can you help us make it happen?

Every Monday and Thursday from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm, and now every Saturday from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm, you can join us for some super cool boxing drills, plenty of strength and conditioning skills, and of course, some light sparring!

We practice on the sanctuary floor below our headquarters, at 1920 E. 17th Street, Santa Ana, CA 92705. Wear some comfortable athletic clothes to sweat in, grab your boxing gloves if you have them, and bring a friend (or 5)! We provide punching bags, so all we need is you to punch them!



Meet Coach Sam!

If you come to NGBC, you will be coached by Coach Sam! Coach Sam attended the University of Southern California, where he boxed for the USC Boxing Team. There, he participated in the United States Intercollegiate Boxing Association's (USIBA) 2016 National Tournament, and was awarded the 141 lbs & 152 lbs Open Division Championship Titles. He has also participated in the USIBA's 2013 National Tournament, was awarded the title of 2013's Male Athlete of the Year, and helped organize the first Collegiate Boxing show at CSUN. Basically, he's pretty cool.

NATI'S HOUSE TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM:

Nati's House is Neutral Ground's transitional housing program, in which we serve youth, young adults, and adults experiencing housing insecurity, many of whom recently exited the youth or adult incarceration system, aged out of the foster care system, or are seeking a safe, neutral space from the streets, sometimes to leave behind gang involvement.

We provide on-site intensive case managers, host weekly check-in meetings, provide first month's groceries and initial clothing, and aid in the rehabilitation of our residents, all with the underlying goal that every person departs our home with independence. Nati's House goes beyond meeting the basic needs by providing structure, accountability, and opportunities to learn and heal in a stable and long-term environment.

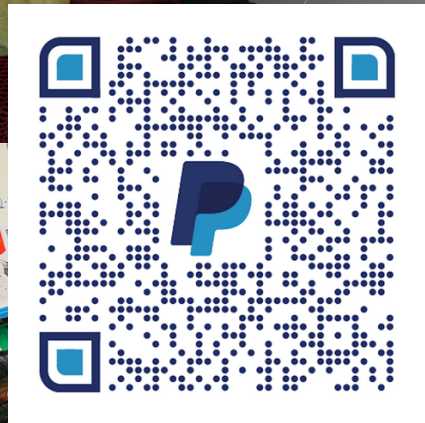
What Your Kindness Can Do
